BACKGROUND

2008 marked the end of an era in the life of St. Luke United Methodist Church with William B. ("Bill") Turner's retirement from teaching youth Sunday School. For more than 60 years, Bill faithfully shared the message of God's love and his own servant leadership journey with teenagers. The depth of his devotion crossed generations and denominations and made a tremendous impact on the lives of countless young people, as well as their families. Quite simply, his service has changed our church and our community.

In appreciation and recognition of Bill's unique love for teenagers, St. Luke has joined with Bill's friends, former students and colleagues throughout the community to establish an endowed Bill Turner Servant Leader Scholarship. The annual presentation of the award is intended to permanently commemorate the connection between Bill, his lessons, and future generations of youth.

OVERVIEW

The Bill Turner Servant Leader Scholarship will award \$2,000 annually to a graduating high school senior who is a member of St. Luke United Methodist Church. The award will be paid to the college or university of the student's choice and can be used to cover the cost of tuition, fees, housing, books and/or other education-related expenses.

The recipient of the Bill Turner Servant Leader Scholarship will:

- Have demonstrated outstanding servant leadership in their ministry associated with St. Luke Church.
- Be selected by a Scholarship Committee via an application process that enables students to detail their church-related activities and share the ways in which their participation at the church has been impacted by the concepts of servant leadership.
- Be evaluated based on the strength of their application, as well as the breadth and depth of their attendance at and participation in St. Luke-related activities, including Sunday School, The Corner youth, mission trips, youth fundraising activities, choir and/or praise bands, and other church programs.
- Be announced during Senior Sunday, May 5, 2019.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants for the Scholarship must:

- Be members of St. Luke United Methodist Church.
- Be graduating from high school during the 2018-2019 school year.
- Complete and submit an application form by 5 p.m. on Sunday, March 24, 2019.
